7.G.1 Scale Drawing Recreating A Graphic

In this activity, you will be redrawing a picture at a different scale.

- 1. Browse the internet and select and print a logo, symbol, cartoon character, etc. that you would like to recreate. The logo must be approved by your teacher.
- 2. You will have to decide on a scale factor. For example, 1:2, 1:3, 1:4, 1:5, etc. Then, choose a unit of measure inches, centimeters, or both. Select a scale factor and unit of measure that will allow you to easily recreate your picture on paper. For example, if you choose a scale factor of 1:4, you might use a grid that has ¼ inch squares on your printed picture and 1 inch squares on your drawing; or a factor of 1:3 with 1 centimeter squares on the picture and 3 inch squares on your drawing.
- 3. After cutting out and gluing the picture to the grid paper, choose a straight edge tool and trace the grid over the top of the original picture.
- 4. Label the rows of the grids with numbers, and the columns of the grids with letters.
- 5. Recreate your picture!
