Tag Resources

Tags are keywords, labels and other information associated with a resource, learning list or learning set. Tags are used as *Filters* when you search for resources. Note: You must be a registered user to tag a resource.

1. Open the Contribute Screen from the *Share* menu on the top of the page or from the home screen.



2. Select the *Tagging Tool*.





3. You can tag a web-based resource, upload a file from another location, or copy a file from your Google Drive. To tag a web-based resource, enter the URL of the resource you want to tag into the box.
