


Learning Lists are the best way to group and organize educational resources that need to be shown as having a direct relationship. The example below is a complete curriculum. Any Learning List can include: documents and several types of files, web pages, and learning standards. Levels, or branches, can show a hierarchical organization with descriptions and instructions.




- Accessible via iPad, tablet, and other mobile devices.
- All documents and resources can be viewed without being forced to download.
- Anyone can follow the Learning List to receive updates in their email.
- Assessments with answer keys can only be viewed by school personnel.
- Contents can be downloaded so entire units are in zipped files or files can be downloaded individually.
- Easy to use and navigate.
- Featured documents ensure key information is on the screen.
- One or more persons can create and control a Learning List.
- Put Learning Lists in libraries and embed them on any website.
- Standards alignment is color coded for Major, Supporting and Additional Standards.
